<p>Sufficient: Has enough evidence to prove your claim.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Did you include enough to support your claim?</i> • <i>Do you have too much evidence?</i>
<p>Precise: Evidence is specific and detailed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Does your evidence have dates, names, statistics, and places?</i> • <i>Did you use quotations or paraphrase evidence?</i>
<p>Accurate: Evidence is factual and based on an effective reading of the source.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Did you get your evidence from a reliable source?</i> • <i>Did you copy the evidence exactly as it was written?</i> • <i>Did you understand the evidence you used?</i>
<p>Relevant: Evidence is well chosen and supports your claim.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Is your evidence related to the claim?</i> • <i>Is this evidence the best evidence for your claim?</i>
<p>Credible: Evidence is from a reliable source.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Is your evidence from a reliable source? (A reliable source would be a textbook.)</i> • <i>Is your evidence from an online source with no author? (Then it is not reliable.)</i>
